SAINTS OF THE WEEK: 6th **February: St Paul Miki & Companions** (c.1562-1597) **Martyr** Born into a well-to-do Japanese family Paul was educated by the Jesuits who had missions in Japan. He became a Jesuit and a well-known and successful preacher making many converts. The local authorities becoming suspicious of the Jesuits and concerned about foreign influence began to persecute Catholics. Paul was arrested and jailed with other Catholics. They were forced to walk 600 miles to Nagasaki where they were crucified. He preached his last sermon from the cross, forgiving his executioners and reminding them that he too was Japanese.

NEW NEWS FROM THE CATHOLIC CHILDREN'S SOCIETY (PLYMOUTH): 2024 was a wonderful year for CCSP thanks to the generosity of all our loyal supporters, parishes, schools and grant funders. Our Annual Appeal, Crib appeal, Great Big Diocesan Quiz, orange box recycling scheme and ink cartridge recycling scheme all raised record breaking totals for our small children's charity. Final totals will be included in the Spring edition of our newsletter 'Children First' which should be sent to all parishes sometime in April. This means that we have been able to help so many families thanks to you all. We receive some wonderful feedback from families who tell us what a massive difference our support makes to their family life. Here is just one recent example - "A huge thank you to the Catholic Children's Society for your kind help, the washing machine arrived today, and everyone is delighted. It is such a huge relief to be able to do our own washing at home again. I'm just so thankful to you. One day when we are in a better position, we will pay the kindness forward and help someone else in a situation similar to mine. Again, thank you."

A second Wills Week: Following our successful inaugural Wills Week last June, we will have another Wills Week slightly earlier this year.
